# LAND GRABBING HOT SPOTS

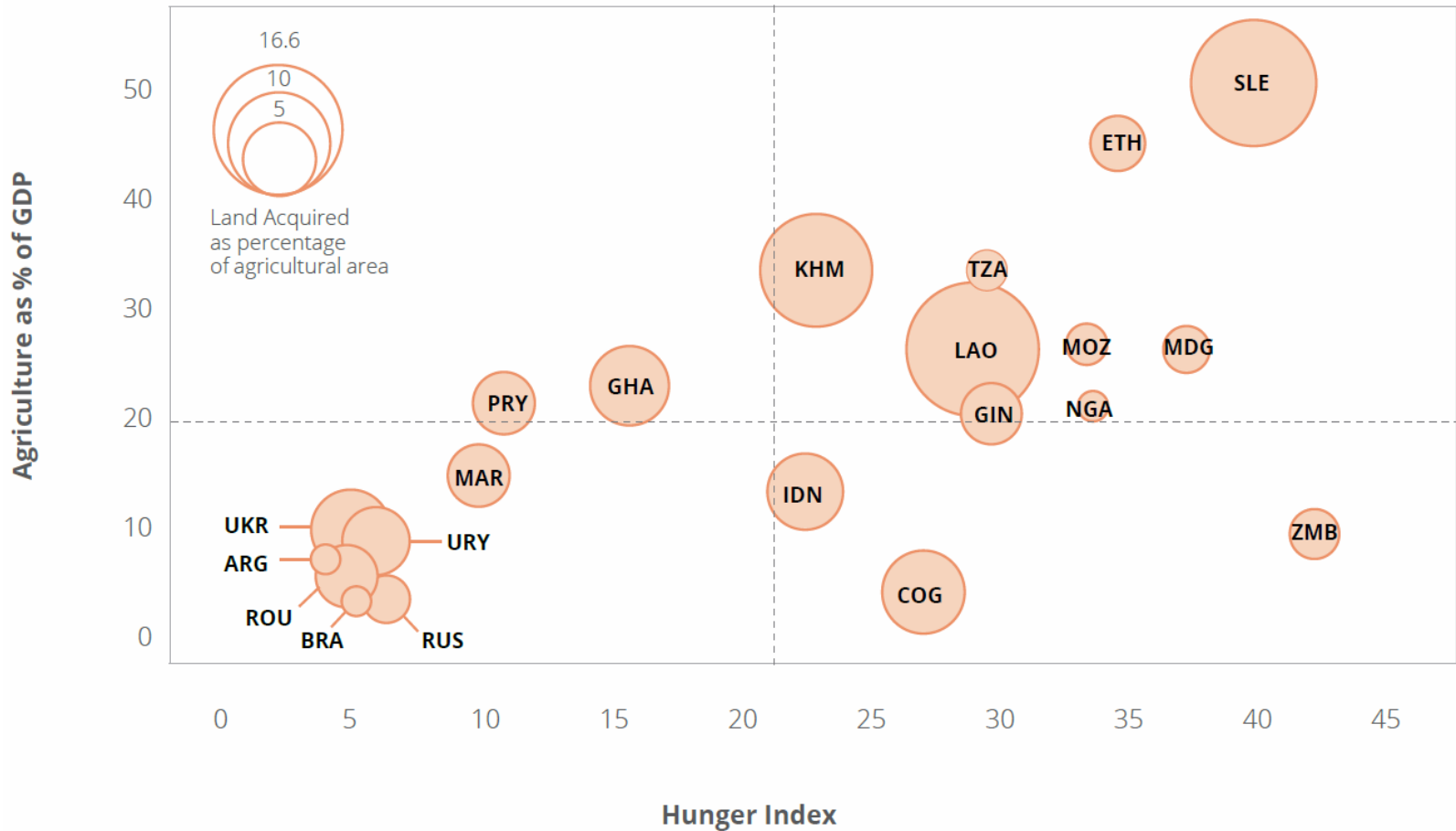




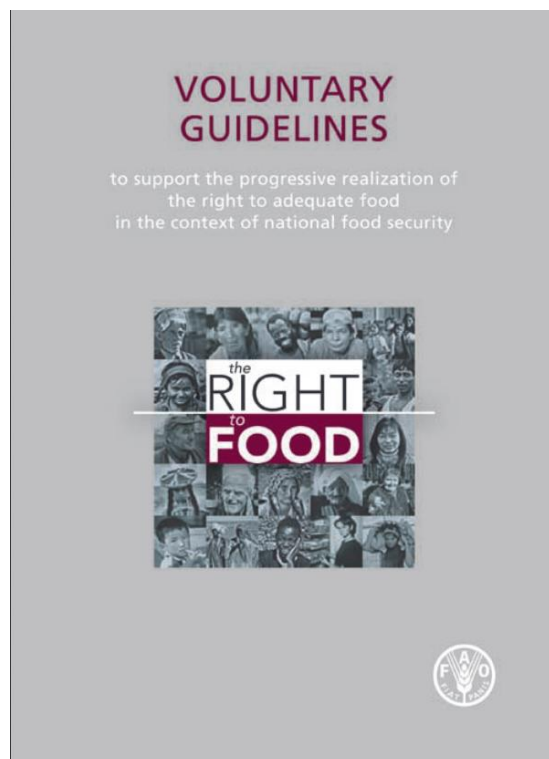
# COUNTRIES WITH HIGH HUNGER SCORES MOST AFFECTED



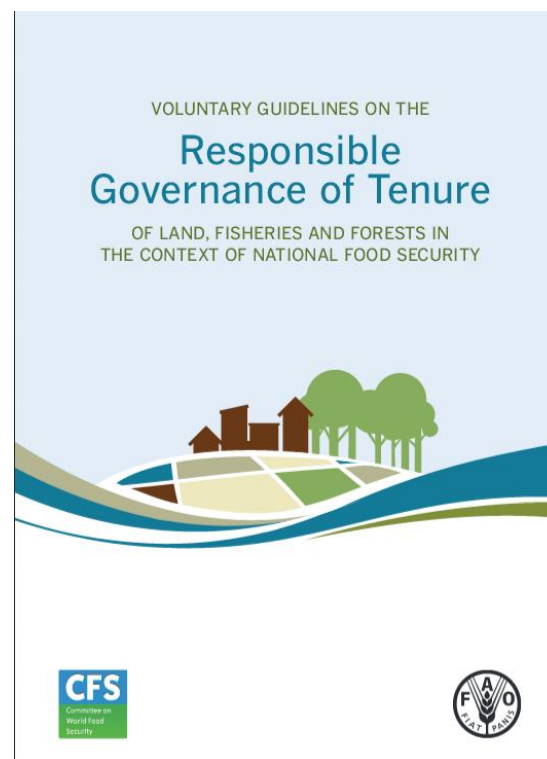
